IMPACT 2023



In 2023 the Community Council of Idaho made a significant contribution to Idaho's Farmworker and rural communities. Through our various programs we affected 21,377 individuals. We have provided essential services in education, health, housing, employment and legal services.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING



We provided housing in 5 communities, Colonia de Colores and El Milagro (Twin Falls), Project Hope (Heyburn), Colonia Cesar Chavez (Blackfoot), and El Rancho Grande Estates (American Falls).

We provided safe and affordable housing to 615 households, in 205 units in our various housing communities. 60 units provided off-farm housing for farmworkers.

COMMUNITY FAMILY CLINIC



We provided comprehensive health care through 3 family medical clinics, in Idaho Falls, Blackfoot, and Roberts, ID. We provide quality affordable primary health care to people regardless of their socio-economic or health insurance status. We provided medical, behavioral health and pharmaceutical services to low-income individuals, with an emphasis on serving the Farmworker community.

In 2023, we provided essential healthcare services to 4,069 individual patients. 90% of the individuals we served were at or below 200% of the area's poverty level.

Employment & Training received a grant from the National Council on Aging which allowed CFC staff to vaccinate 449 seniors and their immediate families.

EMPLOYMENT & TRAINING

The Employment & Training programs of the Community Council of Idaho are delivered through 5 statewide Community Resource Centers, located in Bingham, Bonneville, Canyon, Cassia and Twin Falls counties. At each of these locations we remain committed to our original focus on improving the lives of Migrant & Seasonal Farmworkers (and their dependents), while expanding our community-based services open to everyone.

Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) is a statewide program that provides funding for services to individuals or households in need. These funds are for adults, youth, and seniors to help alleviate the cause and conditions of poverty. *CONT'D*.






LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LIHEAP)



NATIONAL FARMWORKER JOBS PROGRAM (NFJP) is a national program of the US Department of Labor which makes possible services for migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their dependents. The program provides career services, training and educational opportunities for eligible adults, youth farmworkers and their dependents.



YouthBuild provides the opportunity for young adults between 14 - 20 years of age, who lack a high school diploma and financial resources. We work together with these young people to reclaim their education, gain job skills and become community leaders.



Higher Education Equivalency Program (HEP) over 3,000 instructional hours were provided to support students in achieving their General Education Degree (GED), 75 students enrolled in GED classes.

Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) over 6,300 food boxes were distributed through our Community Resources Centers.

FAMILIAS UNIDAS – IMMIGRATION LEGAL SERVICES

Familias Unidas Legal Services is a program of the Community Council of Idaho, established in 2017. Since its inception, the program has provided vital immigration services to the community, assisting clients in navigating the complexities of the immigration process. Over the past three years, the department has focused on serving and educating victims of trafficking and domestic violence. While supporting these individuals, the Board recognized the need for additional legal services tailored to their unique situations. To better reflect these expanded services, the department's name has been updated



In 2023, we opened 106 new matters and served over 300 clients. Additionally, we offered Citizenship Classes to 16 individuals, 10 of whom have already become naturalized U.S. citizens. We also successfully closed 73 cases, including 29 that were initiated during the same year.



MIGRANT & SEASONAL HEAD START

We are a program designated to provide services to migrant & asonal farmworkers and related agricultural workers. This means that we focus our services on Idaho's rural communities through ten educational centers. Our Centers are in agricultural communities, and within these communities both our programs and the farmworkers whom we serve provide a significant contribution to the Idaho Agricultural economy.
